

Scriptures Used In Today's Sermon

Acts 3:1-10

- 1 Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the ninth *hour*, the hour of prayer.
- 2 And a man who had been lame from his mother's womb was being carried along, whom they used to set down every day at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, in order to beg alms of those who were entering the temple.
- 3 When he saw Peter and John about to go into the temple, he *began* asking to receive alms.
- 4 But Peter, along with John, fixed his gaze on him and said, "Look at us!"
- 5 And he *began* to give them his attention, expecting to receive something from them.
- 6 But Peter said, "I do not possess silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you: In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene -- walk!"
- 7 And seizing him by the right hand, he raised him up and immediately his feet and his ankles were strengthened.
- 8 With a leap he stood upright and *began* to walk; and he entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God.
- 9 And all the people saw him walking and praising God;
- 10 And they were taking note of him as being the one who used to sit at the Beautiful Gate of the temple to *beg* alms, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

Deuteronomy 15:4-5 7-11

- 4 However, there will be no poor among you, since the Lord will surely bless you in the land which the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess,
- 5 if only you listen obediently to the voice of the Lord your God, to observe carefully all this commandment which I am commanding you today.
- 7 THEN VERSE 7 "If there is a poor man with you, one of your brothers, in any of your towns in your land which the Lord your God is giving you, you shall not harden your heart, nor close your hand from your poor brother;
- 8 but you shall freely open your hand to him, and shall generously lend him sufficient for his need *in* whatever he lacks.
- 9 Beware that there is no base thought in your heart, saying, 'The seventh year, the year of remission, is near,' and your eye is hostile toward your poor brother, and you give him nothing; then he may cry to the Lord against you, and it will be a sin in you.
- 10 You shall generously give to him, and your heart shall not be grieved when you give to him, because for this thing the Lord your God will bless you in all your work and in all your undertakings.
- 11 For the poor will never cease *to be* in the land; therefore I command you saying, 'You shall freely open your hand to your brother, to your needy and poor in your land.'

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

Revelation 17:14 These will make war with the Lamb, and the Lamb will overcome them, for He is Lord of lords and King of kings; and those who are with Him are called, chosen, and faithful.”
