In Case You Missed It

I’m pretty sure most of you have heard the great commission found in **Matthew 28:19-20** **Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.** At a time when thousands of people were dying each year of rabies, a man named Louis Pasteur, a name most of us remember, a pioneer of immunology, was working on a vaccine. Just as he was about to begin experimenting on himself, a 9 year old boy, Joseph Meister, was bitten by a rabid dog. The boy’s mother begged Pasteur to experiment on her son. Pasteur injected Joseph for ten days - and he lived. Decades later, of all the things Pasteur could have had etched on his headstone, he asked for only these three words: “JOSEPH MEISTER LIVED” Now that is a legacy! not that this man found the cure for rabies or the process for milk and wine that has been given his name the pasteurization process but instead that he saved a young mans life. That got me to think about us, we too are also called to save lives aren’t we? And yes even to take risks to do so. But do we? Do we have the compassion like that for lost souls? For ones that are dying out there and are in real need of saving? Our greatest legacy can be for those who will live eternally maybe because of our efforts. Thousands of people die each year now not from rabies but from never knowing or having a relationship with Jesus Christ. Yet there are so many ways to reach them. But it takes a little effort on our part we ought to risk a little more time, money, or effort in that direction for their sake. Because what we will want said after we pass? What will we want put on our tombstone? Here lies such and such he made the most money, she had the most fun, he was so into himself, he lived a life for himself or did we lose our life long ago and instead took on His identity and lived the rest of our life serving Him and bringing others to Christ. So how will you be remembered? What will people be saying about you then. If we haven’t been doing that its not too late we can start with what we are doing right now today and for Him.
