may test us during this uncertain season. Will we meet it with faith? What will it take for us to be truly satisfied, the bread we eat, or the bread of life? How will we be proved in a day where we must decide.

In Case You Missed It

Exodus 16:3-4 and the people of Israel said to them, "Would that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the meat pots and ate bread to the full, for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger." Then the LORD said to Moses, "**Behold, I am about to rain bread from heaven for you, and the people shall go out and gather a day's portion every day, that I may test them, whether they will walk in my law or not.**"

I know we have heard people say, If I were to just witness a miracle from God I would be dedicated to Him the rest of my life. If he were to do this or that I would be convinced. We even go on to criticize those during this time thinking if I were a part of the group with Moses I would be so dedicated even though all the adults except Caleb and Joshua perished in the wilderness so the question for us is there something about miracles that makes them forgettable? Or is the problem with us? After journeying for a season the children of Israel were faced with hunger — another test. This time, naturally faced with starvation, they murmured against the Lord, AGAIN! You'd think they might begin to put it together that God truly wanted them to trust Him. Apparently not yet. The dire circumstances attacked their great memory of all He did for them and once again they went into attack mode, bitterly complaining in unbelief. The Ten Plagues, the pillar of fire, the Red Sea walk, the Egyptian chariots being swallowed up didn't matter, now none of those helped with their present hunger pangs. Nature trumped the super-natural, and sadly, God Himself. But our God so compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in loving-kindness," what did He do? He poured "angel's food" down upon them (Psalms 78:25); once again providing supernaturally! Jesus tried to tell us the same thing "For this reason I say to you, do not be worried about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor for your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they? Jesus invited us to seek first the Kingdom of God, and His righteousness — and He promised that all of these things will be added unto you! The sad fact that even the lack of food can and very well may be a test for any of us the best of us and it is one of humanity's greatest fears. Hunger
