IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

John 9:1-7

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. 2 His disciples asked him, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?” 3 “Neither this man nor his parents sinned,” said Jesus, “but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. 4 As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me, Night is coming, when no one can work. 5 While I am in the world, I am the light of the world.” 6 After saying this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man’s eyes. 7 “Go,” he told him, “wash in the Pool of Siloam” (this word means “Sent”). So the man went and washed, and came home seeing.

When we read this passage you can’t help but wonder how I would react if someone mixed their saliva with some dirt on the ground and put it on my face like this. Why didn't Jesus just heal this guy and be done with it? Why the dirt and spit? If you'll notice, Jesus did two things. First, He placed mud on the man's eyes. Then, He told him to go and wash himself in the pool of Siloam. Of course, the man willingly obeyed, he was blind and wanted to see.... The mud actually provided the motivation for his obedience. I don’t think he was going to leave the mud on his eyes. My point? We don't always have to understand why we find ourselves muddy sometimes. Perhaps if we weren't muddy, we'd never be motivated to obey! And obedience is crucial to a successful and flourishing walk with the Lord. Let's not despise the mud on our face today. We all have times of trial. Let's use them for an opportunity to be obedient! God is trying to heal and help us see better!
